

# What you need to know about

## the recreational access management program

The Recreational Access Management Pilot Program (RAMP) is intended to:

- enhance the positive values of wildlife
- provide incentives to private landowners for their stewardship of wildlife and habitat
- enhance public access on private lands for hunting and angling
- help diversify the rural economy
- preserve and enhance habitat on private land

Sustainable Resource Development is undertaking this three-year pilot project in Wildlife Management Units 108 and 300 in southwestern Alberta.
